Keynote - Dr. Robert Evans WHO'S AT THE EYEPIECE; WHAT'S ON THE SLIDE? PUBLIC AND PRIVATE PURPOSES AND PROSPECTS IN HEALTH RESEARCH

One of the world's leading health economists, Dr Evans' ground-breaking comparative studies of health care systems and funding strategies have led

to a number of invitations to provide advice to the Canadian federal and provincial governments. He has also served as a consultant and lecturer on health care issues to a number of governments and public agencies in the United States, Europe, Asia and the South Pacific. Dr Evans' writings include several classics in the field, including: "Strained Mercy: The Economics of Canadian Health Care" (1984) and "Why Are Some People Healthy and Others Not? The Determinants of Health of Populations" (1994). Dr Evans received his undergraduate degree in political economy from the University of Toronto, and his PhD in economics from Harvard University.

From this background, Dr. Evans will prognosticate in broad terms about what the future may hold for health research in Canada.
